Presentation goal: explain experiences from Scrum practice	Timing of presentation – only at the end the information was presented. Only then the experiences came from the presenters Presenting style – not vivid enough More details on solutions
Shared experience with rest of the audience (interaction) Last 10 minutes were most interesting (customer/agile contracts)	Presentation tempo -> explain clearer -> faster -> small discussions Watch out for contradictions Prepare the presentation Time management
A lot of feedback from the audience Topic is clearly actual and not solved yet	Start with some facts: sprints = X days, tools used, type of projects... The topic could be better used when positioned as a “discussion” instead of a “listen”
Interactive audience	Fulfil the topic of this session. This session did only touch the beginning of the problem
The subject. Many issues I recognise	Stick more to your slide. Now the last (most interesting) part was rushed. Allow for only a couple of questions, other questions may be parked
Same problems -> recognition	I missed some solutions
	Put more speed in it. Be more convinced and more real life examples
Bad presentation	
Real life examples, interaction with public	Less topics, better time management
The angle: Scrum/iterative tends to take a Product view, not a project setting Lots of room for questions from the audience	A faster pace for the presentation Examples/illustrations (e.g. a picture of the Scrumboard and of the Excel sheet) Present own approach earlier -> allows time for more important feedback
Good idea of trying to show an example	The lightweight Scrum version doesn't look very agile anymore. Seems like a bad example Presentation style too slow: pace up! Global picture was missing
